CATHEDRAL OF THE HOLY FAMILY

2ND SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME



The season of Christmas, which we have just experienced, has renewed in us the awareness that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (Jn 1:14). This consciousness never leaves us; however, in this period it becomes particularly lively and expressive. It becomes the content of the liturgy, but also the content of Christian, family and social customs. We always prepare ourselves for that holy night of God's temporal birth through Advent, as today's Responsorial Psalm proclaims: "I waited patiently for the Lord: he inclined to me and heard my cry" (Ps 40,2). This bowing of the Lord over men is admirable. By becoming a man, and first of all, as a defenseless child, he causes us to bend over to him rather, like Mary and Joseph, like the shepherds, and then the three wise men of the East. We bow with reverence, but also with tenderness. In the earthly birth of his Son, God so much "adapts" to man that he even becomes "man"! And precisely this fact - if we follow the plot of the Psalm - "has put into our mouths a new song, praise to our God" (Ps 40:4). What freshness shines through our Christmas carols! How much they express the closeness of God who became man and weak child! May we never lose the profound meaning of this Mystery! This is very important, dear brothers and sisters: the way we look at ourselves and every man depends on it, how we live this humanity of ours!

Who is Jesus Christ? He who was born on the night of Bethlehem. He who was revealed to the shepherds and magi of the East. But today's Sunday's Gospel once again leads us to the banks of the Jordan where, thirty years after his birth, John the Baptist prepares men for his coming. And when he sees Jesus "coming towards him" he says: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold the one who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29). John affirms that at the Jordan he baptizes "with water so that he - Jesus of Nazareth - might be made known to Israel" (Jn 1:31). We are used to the words: "Lamb of God". And yet these are always wonderful words, mysterious, powerful words. How could John's immediate listeners - who knew the sacrifice of the lamb connected with the night of Israel's exodus from slavery in Egypt - understand them! The further verses of today's Responsorial Psalm explain more fully what was revealed to the Jordan through the words of John the Baptist, and which had already begun on the night in Bethlehem. The Psalm addresses God with the words of the psalmist, but indirectly it brings back the word of the eternal Son who became man: "Sacrifice and offering you do not like, you have opened my ears. You did not ask for burnt offering and victim for guilt. Then I said: "Behold, I am coming. On the scroll of my book it is written that I do your will. My God, this is what I desire" (Ps 40:7-9).

Thus, dear brothers and sisters, we have been "sanctified in Christ Jesus". And we are "called to be saints together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor 1:2). Jesus Christ is the Lamb of God who says of himself: "My God, I desire to do your will, your law is in the depths of my heart" (cf. Ps 40:9). What is holiness? It is precisely the joy of doing God's will. This joy is experienced by man through constant work on himself, through fidelity to the Divine law, to the commandments of the Gospel. And also not without renunciations. Man participates in this joy always and exclusively through the work of Jesus Christ the Lamb of God. How eloquent is the fact that we listen to the words spoken by John at the Jordan when we have to approach to receive Christ into our hearts with Eucharistic Communion! He comes to us who brings the joy of doing God's will. He who brings holiness. Pope Saint John Paul II, 1981


